

The Mahaiwe Story

The Mahaiwe Performing Arts Center rests on the traditional lands of the Stockbridge-Munsee tribe of the Mohican nation in a "place downstream." Referencing the Mohican name, the theater, built by local businessmen, opened for live performances in 1905. Films followed, and by the early '30s, the theater added its signature movie marquee. Facing prospective demolition in the '80s, it gained protection under the formation of Great Barrington's Historic District and, in 2008, was listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

In 2002, Founder Lola Jaffe and a dedicated board and staff raised and invested over \$9 million to restore the aged but beloved Mahaiwe in time for a Centennial Celebration in 2005, with the launch of year-round performing arts programming. The Mahaiwe continues into its second century as a community gathering place, thanks to member support.
